Today the Church celebrates the Fourth Sunday of Advent. We light the last candle on our Advent wreath and we are so close to Christmas. This final candle, the "Angel's Candle," symbolizes peace. It reminds us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."

Jesus' earthly existence begins with Mary's "Yes" in today's account of the Annunciation. We need to say a courageous and generous "Yes" to God as Mary did. True obedience comes from a free choice made in the light of what is true and good. It often requires a

deal of courage, because it can involve going against the tide of social expectations. Jesus' own moment of greatness, like his Mother's, came when He said "Yes," to his Father in Gethsemane, and Jesus' own obedience is our model. Will we surrender to God and allow God to do what, from our human point of view, seems impossible? It is by saying, with Jesus and Mary, a wholehearted and totally unconditional "Yes," to God that Jesus will be re-born in each of us – or maybe even born in us for the first time. By my saying "yes," Jesus may well be born or reborn in others too.


