THE SCRUTINIES OF THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS CELEBRATED ON THE THIRD, FOURTH, AND FIFTH SUNDAYS OF LENT

What are the "Scrutinies"?

our faith journey.

These very special rites are celebrated on the middle three Sundays of Lent, at liturgies where the Elect are present. The Elect are those in our midst who are preparing for Baptism. Part of their journey is that they have been received among us, the Rite of Acceptance, and they have been enrolled in the Book of the Elect in the Rite of Election.

In order to inspire in the Elect a desire for purification and redemption by Christ, three scrutinies are celebrated. By this means, first of all, the Elect are instructed gradually about the mystery of sin, from which the whole world and every person longs to be delivered and thus saved from its present and future consequences. Second, their spirit is filled with Christ the Redeemer, who is the living water (gospel - the Samaritan woman in the first scrutiny), the light of the world (gospel - the man born blind in the second scrutiny), the resurrection and the life (gospel – the raising of Lazarus in the third scrutiny). From the first to the final scrutiny the Elect should progress in their perception of sin and their desire for salvation. These are ancient rites and they may, at first, seem strange to us. But they are profoundly rooted in our human experience. We need to examine (scrutinize) how we are, the areas of our lives where we are tempted, or seriously sin - in what we do and what we fail to do. We really need healing and the strength that can come from the support of our sisters and brothers. Even if these rites are not celebrated at the liturgy we attend, or not celebrated in our parish or congregation at all, it can be

wonderful to reflect upon the journey these Elect are making during Lent, as an inspiration and source of renewal for us in



THE FIRST SCRUTINY -

THE WOMAN AT THE WELL (John 4:3-42) Why did the Samaritan woman come to draw water at noon, the hottest time of the day? Did she want to avoid the times the other women in town came to the well? What are the places in my life where I am embarrassed, where I

avoid interaction with others? What are the noon day wells of my life? Can I imagine Jesus approaching me there? How do I put Jesus off, with excuses, with problems, with barriers? I don't have time; I haven't done this before; my stuff's too complicated. Can I find the words to say to Jesus that He is the one I have thirsted for all my life?

THE SACRAMENT OF MERCY AND LOVE

Has Confession been a part of your Lenten journey? Do not lose another day. **Be courageous, and go to Confession!**

Lent is a new beginning, a path leading to Easter, Christ's victory over death. This season urgently calls us to conversion. We are asked to return to God with all our hearts, and to grow in friendship with the Lord. Jesus is the faithful friend who never abandons us. Even when we sin, He patiently awaits our return and is always ready to forgive us.

We need to guard and protect our hearts, just as we protect our home with a lock. How often do bad thoughts, bad intentions, jealousy, envy enter? Who opened the door? How did those things get in?

The best way to guard one's heart is with the daily practice of an **Examination of Conscience**, in which one quietly reviews what bad things one has done and what good things one has failed to do for God, one's neighbor and oneself.

- Do I only turn to God when I'm in need?
- Do I attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation?
- Do I begin and end the day with prayer?
- Am I embarrassed to show that I am a Christian?
- Do I rebel against God's plan?
- Am I envious, hot-tempered, biased?
- Am I honest and fair with everyone?
- In my marital and family relations, do I uphold morality as taught in the Gospels?
- Do I honor and respect my parents?
- Have I refused newly conceived life? Have I snuffed out the gift of life? Have I helped to do so?
- Do I respect the environment?
- Am I part worldly and part believer?
- Do I overdo it with eating, drinking, smoking and amusements?
- Am I overly concerned about my physical well-being, my possessions?
- How do I use my time? Am I lazy?
- Do I want to be served?
- Do I dream of revenge, hold grudges?
- Am I meek, humble and a builder of peace?

It is important that we go to Confession, in front of a priest who embodies Jesus and is called to dispense the mercy, pardon and love of Christ. It is being face-to-face with someone who acts in 'persona Christi' to welcome and forgive us. It becomes the vehicle through which grace reaches and heals us. Let us thank God for this overabundant gift of love and mercy.
